NYS Environmental Facilities Corp. Approves \$3.6 Million in Grant and Interest-Free Financing for Water Upgrades in Town of Randolph

The Board of Directors of the Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) today approved \$2 million in grant funding and \$1.6 million no-interest financing for water distribution improvements in the Town of Randolph.

The project includes the decommissioning of wells, new well sources, improvements to the town's water tank, and the installation of new water meters.

"EFC and the New York State Department of Health are pleased to have been able to assist the Town of Randolph in providing its residents with safe, high quality water at an affordable cost," said Matthew J. Driscoll, EFC's President and CEO. "Through New York's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, municipalities throughout the state are taking important steps to improve drinking water quality and protect public health for generations to come."

These upgrades will allow the Town of Randolph to comply with the surface treatment rule, while improving drinking water quality and system dependability for their residents.

Project construction is expected to commence this year.

Funding for the Randolph project will come from New York's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF), which is jointly administered by EFC and the New York State Department of Health (DOH).

EFC is the arm of Governor Andrew Cuomo's administration that provides low-cost financing to help local governments afford major improvements to wastewater and drinking water infrastructure.
